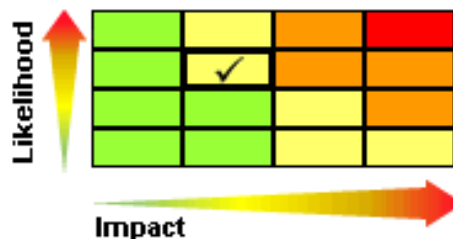
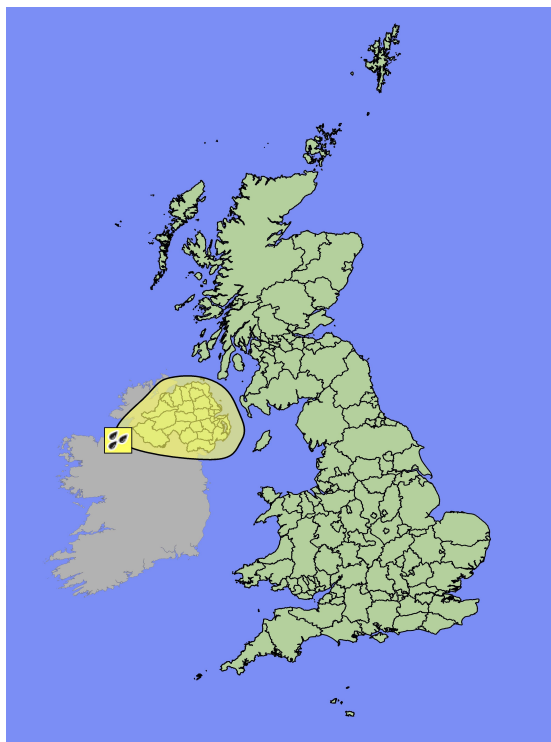




National Severe Weather Warning Service



Chief Forecasters Assessment

Another active frontal band will transfer northwards across Northern Ireland later Thursday bringing a further spell of heavy rain to areas already close to saturation. Expect 10-15 mm to fall quite widely and locally 30-50 mm in wettest areas.

The Met Office have issued a **Yellow Warning of Rain**

Valid from **18:00 on Thu, 16th Aug 2012** until **03:00 on Fri, 17th Aug 2012**

Another spell of heavy rain will spread northwards across the region later Thursday with the heaviest rain expected during the late evening. Clearer conditions will follow from the south during the early hours of Friday.

The public should be aware of the possibility of surface water and spray on roads and perhaps isolated cases of surface water flooding.
