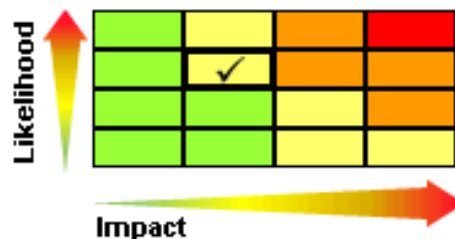
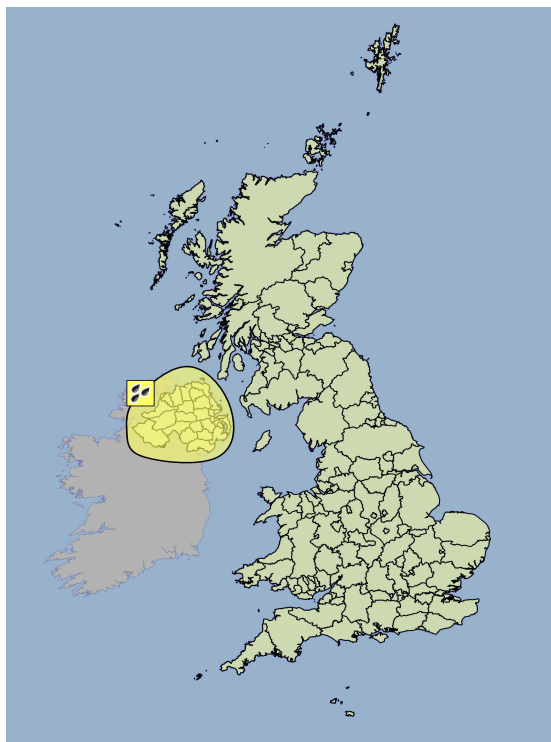




National Severe Weather Warning Service



Chief Forecasters Assessment

An active frontal system will move northwards across Northern Ireland, bringing a band of heavy rain and possible thunderstorms on Monday evening, clearing from the south into the early hours of Tuesday. Some areas could receive 15-20 mm of rain within 3 to 6 hours.

The Met Office have issued a **Yellow Warning of Rain**

Valid from **16:00 on Mon, 31st Mar 2014** until **04:00 on Tue, 01st Apr 2014**

Scattered heavy showers may develop over parts of Northern Ireland later this afternoon before a band of heavy rain follows slowly northwards during Monday evening, clearing to the north during the early hours of Tuesday.

The public should be aware of the risk of some localised disruption to travel due to surface water flooding.
