



National Severe Weather Warning Service



Chief Forecasters Assessment

Winds will strengthen around southwest parts of the UK through Wednesday morning, particularly as a band of showers moves southeastwards across parts of Wales and southwest England.

Along the band of showers there is scope for some locally squally winds and so disruption to travel but the period of strongest winds will be short lived.

The Met Office have issued a **Yellow Warning of Wind**

Valid from **08:00 on Wed, 02nd Mar 2016** until **13:00 on Wed, 02nd Mar 2016**

A band of wintry showers will cross the southwest of Wales and southwest England on Wednesday morning with winds strengthening in association. Gusts of 70 mph are likely for a time, mainly around coasts, though isolated gusts in of 60-70 mph are also possible inland in heavier showers. Winds will ease again as the band of showers clears by early afternoon.

This warning has been updated to expand the warning area slightly, increase possible maximum inland gusts, and extend the validity time into early afternoon.

Please be aware of localised disruption to travel.
