Confidence: High for the overall story on Sunday and Monday, and for the general warming trend. Lower for detail in cloud amounts and precipitation through the outlook period.

Headline for Sunday 03 Jul 2022: A largely cloudy start with patchy drizzle. Bright, sunny spells by the afternoon, perhaps seeing the odd shower.

Forecast for Sunday 03 Jul 2022

Weather: A cloudy morning, with patchy rain and drizzle on western-most slopes initially. Cloud gradually breaking to give sunny spells and a risk of isolated showers into the late morning. Brighter towards Abergavenny throughout. Drier into the afternoon and evening with lengthening sunny spells as skies clear.

Chance of cloud-free hill tops above 600m: 20% chance at first, but 60% in the far east. Rising across the Park to above 80% by the afternoon.

Low cloud and visibility: Extensive low cloud with bases around 300-400m this morning, with patches of cloud from low slopes upwards in the far west of the Park initially. Conditions fairly slow to improve, with cloud bases lifting to above the summits by early afternoon. Visibility poor under cloud base initially, particularly in any rain, drizzle or early showers. Visibility still reducing in any isolated showers during the afternoon, but remaining good to very good otherwise.

Meteorologist's View

Conditions for navigating will be challenging during the morning, owing to poor visibilities and slippery paths due to rain drizzle or showers. Conditions improving by late morning, and more widely improving by the afternoon. With strong sunshine and good drying conditions, so both waterproofs and adequate sun protection is recommended.

Forecast for Monday 04 Jul 2022

Weather: Cloud spreading eastward across the Park during the morning, bringing some patchy light rain, perhaps turning showery at times. Brighter conditions from the west during the afternoon with sunny spells, although the outside chance of an isolated light shower remains. Feeling cool on higher summits due to strengthening winds.

Maximum wind: Westerly 15-20mph, gusting 25-30mph on the summits

Chance of cloud-free hill tops 600m: 40% as cloud spills east during the morning, quickly rising to above 80%.

Low cloud and visibility: Cloud spreading eastward with bases around 400-500m, with higher summits briefly shrouded, particularly across the Black Mountains. Better in the east throughout. Some early mist may form in the valleys, clearing readily after dawn. Cloud bases generally above the summits by late morning. Visibility briefly poor in any morning light rain or showers, becoming very good with only slight deteriorations in further showers.

Temperature: **Valleys:** Plus 11 Celsius, rising to plus 19 Celsius.
At 600m: Plus 6 Celsius, rising to plus 10 Celsius.
Freezing level: Above the summits.
