Forecast for Saturday 07 May 2022

Weather: Rather cloudy start with some patchy light rain or drizzle, generally focused across southern peaks such as Ben Alder. Gradually turning drier and brighter from the north from late morning and through the afternoon.

Chance of cloud-free hill tops above 800m: Initially 20% in south and 70% in north, becoming for the afternoon 70% in north, 90% plus in north.

Low cloud and visibility: Moderate or poor in early light rain or drizzle, very poor within associated cloud, being quite extensive in south and broken in north from 600m, before lifting and breaking from the north from late morning.

Met Office Aberdeen Meteorologist's View

Severe wind chill at first at height, coupled with quite extensive hill fog in the south. Sunburn in exposure later.

Forecast for Sunday 08 May 2022

Weather: Most if not all staying dry with good bright or sunny spells appearing, however temperatures will be a little down from Friday.

Maximum wind: South mean 15-20mph with gusts reaching 30-35mph across most exposed ridges and summits.

Chance of cloud-free hill tops above 800m: 90% plus

Low cloud and visibility: Typically good or very good.

Temperature: **Glens:** Plus 4 Celsius increasing 17 Celsius during the afternoon
At 800m: Plus 4 Celsius increasing 8 Celsius during the afternoon
Freezing level: Around 1500m
