Forecast for Friday 09 Dec 2022

Weather: Snow showers will turn heavier overnight, then more scattered by morning with a few clear intervals. Rather cloudy with some occasional hill fog and light snow showers, limited sunny intervals through daylight hours. Some heavier snow showers returning late afternoon onwards with the slight chance of lightning.

Chance of cloud-free hill tops above 800m: 30%.

Low cloud and visibility: Areas of cloud to 600-800m, lower patches near snow showers, especially Northern Cairngorms and Ladder Hills with very poor visibility in cloud, heavier snow showers, and in drifting or blizzard conditions. Spells of good visibility below cloud during the day.

Met Office Aberdeen Meteorologist's View

Despite modest wind speeds, sub-zero temperatures at most levels will lead to a bitterly cold day.

Forecast for Saturday 10 Dec 2022

Weather: Mostly cloudy with occasional snow showers, some heavy. Further accumulations, also affecting access roads. Hill fog. Enough lying snow and wind to bring drifting snow and blizzard conditions on the higher hills.

Maximum wind: Northeast 25 gusts 35mph.

Chance of cloud-free hill tops above 800m: 20%

Low cloud and visibility: Frequent cloud at 600-750m and lowering to 450m in snow showers. Very poor visibility in cloud and the heavier snow showers, but good away from cloud and in drier spells..

Temperature: **Glens:** Minus 3 Celsius rising to Plus 1 at best.
At 800m: Minus 4 Celsius
Freezing level: All levels
