Forecast for Sunday 04 Sep 2022

Weather: Outbreaks of from the start of Sunday and continue on and off throughout the morning. These could be heavy at times, particularly across western parts of the park. Remaining rather cloudy throughout the afternoon with showers developing, again heavy at times and also with the risk of thunder and hail. Showers continuing into the evening and merging into longer spells of rain at times. Remaining mild and humid overnight.

Chance of cloud-free hill tops above 600m: 40% for much of the day.

Low cloud and visibility: Poor or moderate visibility expected on higher slopes with cloud bases between 400-500m for much of the day. Rain and showers also temporarily dropping visibility to poor at lower levels.

Forecast for Monday 05 Sep 2022

Weather: A cloudy start with outbreaks of rain pushing across the park during the early hours of Monday morning, these heavy at times. Turning drier for late morning with some sunny spells developing and then remaining largely dry for the afternoon outside of an isolated shower. Rain and heavy showers returning again for the evening.

Maximum wind: 35mph southeasterly winds, gusting 45-50mph, on the summits to start the day. Easing to 25mph winds, gusting 35-40mph, for the afternoon.

Chance of cloud-free hill tops above 600m: 40% to begin, rising to 80% for late morning onwards.

Low cloud and visibility: Cloud bases first thing dropping to 500m with accompanying rain also lowering visibilities at lower levels to poor. Once cleared, cloud rising to above the summits from late morning onwards. Visibility also largely good for the afternoon but dropping to poor again as rain returns for the evening.

Temperature: **Valleys:** Plus 13 Celsius, rising plus 23 Celsius.
At 600m: Plus 11 Celsius, rising to plus 14 Celsius.
Freezing level: Well above the summits.
