Forecast for Friday 04 Mar 2022

Weather: Mainly light snow, with rain below around 500m, through the early hours and the morning. This persistent across the Cairngorms, but patchy further west with Creag Meagaidh and Ben Alder ranges likely to be largely dry by midday. Persistent snow should clear east in the afternoon, with brighter conditions developing in the west but scattered snow showers early to mid-afternoon. All ranges likely to be dry with some clear spells by late evening.

Chance of cloud-free hill tops above 800m: 10-20% in the morning, 60% in the afternoon, best chance in the west.

Low cloud and visibility: Very poor in low cloud and snow with whiteout conditions, these likely to persist much of the day over the Cairngorms. Cloud extensive above 700-800m, but breaking up and lifting to around 1100m in the west, then perhaps also the Cairngorms through the afternoon. Visibility generally good below the cloud base, but 5-10 km in rain at low levels.

Met Office Aberdeen Meteorologist's View

Persistent whiteout conditions for much of the day across the Cairngorms, but uncertainty in how far west these extend and how quickly they clear. Beware of icy conditions on paths where snowmelt from Thursday is likely to refreeze.

Forecast for Saturday 05 Mar 2022

Weather: Lengthy clear spells through the early hours to give a cold frosty start. Then a cold day with good sunny spells, best towards Ben Alder. Cloudier across the Monadhliath and Cairngorms, but still dry and bright. Northerly winds will give a chilly feel in the morning, but these should ease in the afternoon. A dry evening with clear spells.

Maximum wind: North 20 gusting 25 mph, becoming northeast 10-15 mph through the afternoon.

Chance of cloud-free hill tops above 800m: 80%

Low cloud and visibility: Very good or excellent. Western hills likely to be cloud free, but occasional cloud will drift across the higher tops of the Cairngorms at times.

Temperature: **Glens:** Minus 3 Celsius rising to plus 5 Celsius
At 800m: Minus 4 Celsius rising to minus 1 or zero Celsius.
Freezing level: Down to the glens, rising to 600m by day.
