Forecast valid from 06:00 on Tuesday 08 Feb 2022 until 23:59 on Wednesday 09 Feb 2022

Forecast Issued on Tuesday 08 Feb 2022 at 01:09

Confidence: A lot of uncertainty on Tuesday as a band of rain moves south but stalls just to the north of Wales however if the band of rain moves slightly further south towards the Brecon Beacons it may be quite a dull day and conditions poorer than forecast can be expected. Otherwise an unsettled, cold week with strong winds at times and wintry showers from Wednesday.

Headline for Tuesday 08 Feb 2022: Likely to be a cloudy, dull day with some intermittent drizzle in the west.

Forecast for Tuesday 08 Feb 2022

Weather: Rain band is expected to stall to the north of Wales, and conditions over the area will be mainly dry, perhaps some drizzle for western hills but some brightness in the east. However if the band of rain moves south and stalls over North Wales conditions may be poorer than forecast with more cloud in the west.

Chance of cloud-free hill tops above 600m: 70%, best chance around eastern areas towards Abergavenny with the northern and western hills towards Carreg Cennen likely to see more broken cloud.

Low cloud and visibility: Scattered low cloud for the western hills 500m and above for much of the day, cloud likely to be more patchy further south and east with bases around 600m and likely to get good views during the day. Visibility will be reduced in any light rain and drizzle although mostly dry for all hills.

Forecast for Wednesday 09 Feb 2022

Weather: Some overnight rain will clear through during the morning to leave a dry and fresh day with some bright spells, small risk of a wintry shower too. Any showers will likely be wintry on the highest tops. Brisk westerly winds will move any showers through quite quickly but will also add to a significant wind chill on the higher ground.

Maximum wind: West 15-20 mph with gusts 25-30mph.

Chance of cloud-free hill tops 600m: 90%, good views likely with some lower cloud expected as showers pass but clearing quickly.

Low cloud and visibility: Scattered cloud layers above 500m. Visibility will be very good with some far reaching views likely but in any wintry showers visibility may fall to a few kilometres.

Temperature: **Valleys:** Around 7 Celsius.
At 600m: Plus 4 Celsius falling to zero Celsius later.
Freezing level: 1600m falling to 700m.
