


National Severe Weather Warning Service



Chief Forecasters Assessment
 An active frontal system containing very moist air looks likely to bring over 100 mm of rain to parts of upland northwest England and 60 mm for upland parts of western Scotland, though in general amounts will be much smaller in low lying areas and any disruption is expected to be very localised.

The Met Office have issued a **Yellow Warning of Rain**

Valid from **00:00 on Wed, 22nd Feb 2012** until **21:00 on Wed, 22nd Feb 2012**

Rain will become persistent and heavy across many parts of western Scotland and northwestern areas of England during Wednesday, clearing from the northwest later. The rain will be accompanied by southwesterly gales, with gusts of 50-60 mph.

The public should be aware that the cumulative effect of the rainfall may lead to some localised, minor flooding issues during Wednesday.
