Forecast for Saturday 06 Mar 2021

Weather: Lengthy clear spells through the early hours will lead to a sunny but cold start with a frost likely in the glens. Then a dry bright day with cloud gradually increasing. Dry but cloudy in the evening.

Chance of cloud free mountain/hill tops above 800m: 80-90%

Visibility: Very good with cloud bases expected to be generally above the summits. Occasional patches of cloud may reduce visibility across higher summits around Braemar and upper Deeside at times in the afternoon and evening.

Met Office Aberdeen Meteorologist's View

Snow fields will be hard and icy.

Forecast for Sunday 07 Mar 2021

Weather: Mostly dry but cloudy through the early hours and the morning, some brighter spells at times. Cloud thickening from late morning with some patchy light rain at times in the afternoon and evening, sleet or wet snow at munro level.

Maximum wind: West 15-20 mph, occasionally gusting 25-30 mph.

Chance of cloud free mountain/hill tops above 800m: 80-90% in the morning falling to 10-20% in the afternoon

Visibility: Good in the morning, cloud bases mainly above the summits. Falling to poor at height in the afternoon with cloud often persistent above 700m.

Temperature: **Glens:** Plus 1 Celsius rising to 8 Celsius.
At 800m: Zero Celsius rising to plus 2 Celsius.
Freezing level: 1000m, rising above the summits shortly after dawn
