Forecast for Thursday 03 Mar 2022

Weather: Extensive low cloud for much the day. Patchy rain or drizzle, snow above 600m, through the morning, mainly across southern hills after dawn with wet snow becoming confined to munro level. Rain and summit snow turn heavy and more widespread for a few hours mid-afternoon. Becoming dry in the evening with a chance of some cloud breaks.

Chance of cloud-free hill tops above 800m: Nil by day, 10-20% in the evening.

Low cloud and visibility: Very poor visibility, near zero in blizzard conditions near summits. Extensive cloud down to 400m, occasionally lower levels in the south. Low cloud may break up for a few hours in the evening to give temporary good visibility, but the extent of this uncertain, most likely across western hills.

Met Office Aberdeen Meteorologist's View

Challenging conditions on the hills with rain, sleet and wet snow, combined with strong to gale force winds, resulting in significant wind chill. Winds across the higher summits likely to be 10 mph stronger than in the table Thursday morning.

Forecast for Friday 04 Mar 2022

Weather: Snow showers, with rain below around 600-700m, likely to turn frequent in the early hours. This most likely becoming confined to the Northern Cairngorms during the morning where it may persist for much of the day, most likely in the east. A largely dry but cloudy afternoon and evening west of the Cairngorms.

Maximum wind: North 10-15 mph, occasionally 20 gusting 30 mph in the afternoon.

Chance of cloud-free hill tops above 800m: 20% early morning. Improving to 60% in west through the afternoon.

Low cloud and visibility: Likely to be poor for most of the day across the Northern Cairngorms with cloud extensive above 600m. Becoming mostly good west of the Cairngorms in the afternoon with a cloud lifting above the summits.

Temperature: **Glens:** Plus 3 Celsius rising to 5 Celsius.

At 800m: Minus 1 Celsius falling to minus 3 Celsius in the evening.

Freezing level: 900-1000m, falling to 700m in the morning, 600m in the afternoon.
