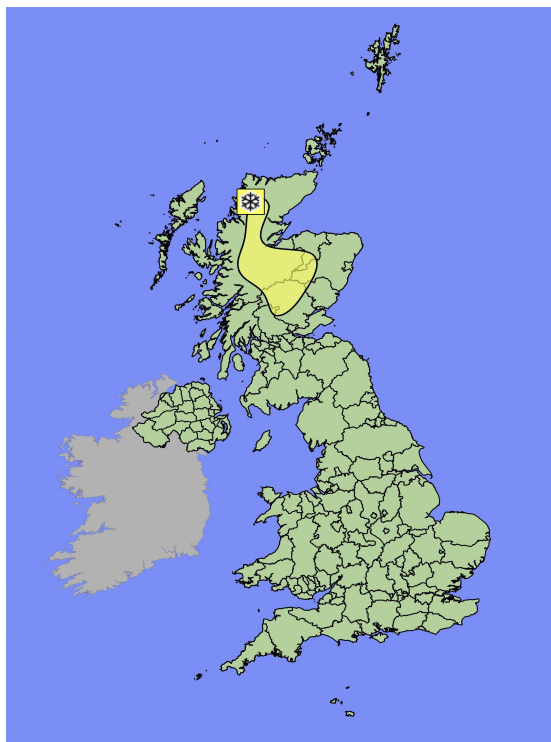




## National Severe Weather Warning Service



### Chief Forecasters Assessment

An active frontal system will approach Scotland from the west. As it runs into cold air over Scotland, rain will turn to snow for a time. Some 5 to 10cm of snow is likely on ground above about 300m but there will also be some slushy deposits of locally 2 to 5cm at lower levels briefly.

The Met Office have issued a **Yellow Warning of Snow**

Valid from **04:00 on Thu, 08th Dec 2011** until **09:00 on Thu, 08th Dec 2011**

Snow is likely for a time on Thursday morning across parts of central and northern Scotland, particularly affecting higher ground, but with some slushy deposits locally to lower levels. The public should be aware that it could cause some disruption to travel.
