



## National Severe Weather Warning Service



### Chief Forecasters Assessment

A depression will move northwards to the east of Scotland today bringing heavy rain and strong to gale force winds to parts of northeast Scotland. Rainfall totals of the order 20 to 40 mm are likely. The rain should gradually ease on Thursday night.

The Met Office have issued a **Yellow Warning of Rain**

Valid from **13:00 on Thu, 22nd May 2014** until **22:00 on Thu, 22nd May 2014**

Rain will become persistent and heavy at times this afternoon and evening, easing on Thursday night. In addition, northwesterly winds will be strong with gales along the Aberdeenshire coast.

The public should be aware that surface water and strong winds will lead to difficult travel conditions.
