Forecast for Friday 03 Sep 2021

Weather: Cloudy overnight and into Friday morning with extensive hill fog and the odd patch of drizzle gradually dying out. Then dry and becoming brighter with sunny spells developing later in the morning. However stubborn cloud will linger all day over parts of north Highlands.

Chance of cloud free mountain/hill tops above 800m: 20% at first improving 70% by afternoon.

Visibility: Poor with extensive cloud cover well down the hills at first. Good visibility over hills towards west coast extending to many areas with clouds lifting and breaking up by the afternoon.

Met Office Aberdeen Meteorologist's View

Sunny spells developing during morning and with moderate or high UV levels there will be a sunburn risk.

Forecast for Saturday 04 Sep 2021

Weather: Another dry day and a rather cloudy start. It will become brighter during the morning with sunny spells over many ranges in the afternoon.

Maximum wind: Southeasterly winds will freshen over the tops during the day. Average speeds of 10mph increasing 20mph in the afternoon.

Chance of cloud free mountain/hill tops above 800m: 30% improving 60% in the afternoon.

Visibility: Poor in association with extensive cloud cover well down the hills at first. Then good visibility beneath the cloud sheet which will lift and break up in the afternoon.

Temperature: **Glens:** 9 Celsius rising to 19 Celsius
At 800m: 13 Celsius.
Freezing level: Above the summits.
