Confidence: High for a change to southwesterly winds into Monday and for some rain through the week, but lower confidence for amounts and timings of rain Tuesday and Wednesday. Low confidence later in week.

Headline for Monday 08 Nov 2021: Mainly bright start, but cloud thickening to bring rain, some heavy in afternoon, with extensive hill fog and also becoming windy at height.

Forecast for Monday 08 Nov 2021

Weather: Fog patches in early hours, but clearing overnight as cloud increases. A mainly dry and bright start but cloud thickening and lowering through the morning to bring outbreaks of rain. More persistent and heavier rain in the afternoon, with extensive hill fog at height

Chance of cloud free mountain/hill tops above 800m: 70% at first, becoming almost nil by the afternoon.

Visibility: Mainly good at first, but falling poor with rain and drizzle and very poor at height, with extensive cloud and fog above 400 or 500m by the afternoon, but occasionally 300m in rain, especially on western fells

Meteorologist's View

Mild and rather humid day with some heavy rain bringing uncomfortable walking conditions. Becoming windy at height, and there could also be stronger more gusty winds at lower levels on leeward slopes.

Forecast for Tuesday 09 Nov 2021

Weather: Cloudy, with extensive hill fog and further rain, still heavy at times, but clearing late afternoon with clear spells developing in the evening though a few showers too.

Maximum wind: Southwest 30-35 gust 45mp. Turning westerly and easing 10-20mph after dark.

Chance of cloud free mountain/hill tops above 800m: Almost nil, but becoming 60 or 70% after dark in the evening.

Visibility: Perhaps occasionally good at low levels, but mostly moderate or poor and very poor above 300 or 400m through most of the day, with extensive cloud and fog. Mainly good in evening.

Temperature: **Valleys:** Plus 10 or 11 C, decreasing plus 7 C later
At 800m: Plus 7 C, later plus 4 C
Freezing level: Above summits
