


National Severe Weather Warning Service



Chief Forecasters Assessment
 Cold air will persist across Scotland with some showers. The showers will be mostly light and well-scattered, with snow on high ground and sleet possible to lower levels. However the main hazard will be ice with clear periods between the showers allowing untreated surfaces to freeze.

The Met Office have issued a **Yellow Warning of Ice**

Valid from **19:00 on Thu, 03rd Mar 2016** until **09:00 on Fri, 04th Mar 2016**

Clear periods on Thursday evening and overnight will allow icy stretches to form on untreated surfaces, especially areas affected by showers. The showers will mainly affect parts of northern Scotland, wintry at times, with some developing elsewhere during the night.

Please be aware of some difficult driving conditions.
