Forecast for Saturday 06 Mar 2021

Weather: Dry for much of the day. Rather cloudy with the best of any sunny spells across eastern ranges. Cloud thickens across Skye and near the northwest coast in the afternoon with the chance of a few spots of rain and summit snow, these increasing in the evening.

Chance of cloud free mountain/hill tops above 800m: 80% in the morning, 40-60% by mid-afternoon, best chance in the south.

Visibility: Very good with cloud bases expected to be generally above the summits in the morning, some patches down to 600m near the coast in the northwest. Turning poor in the afternoon across the northwest with cloud bases lowering to 500-600m, but likely to remain good south of Skye with cloud bases mostly above the summits here.

Met Office Aberdeen Meteorologist's View

Snow fields will be hard and icy. Freezing level generally around 200-300m higher than in the table to the north of Torridon from around midday.

Forecast for Sunday 07 Mar 2021

Weather: Patchy rain and summit snow mostly confined to the northwest coast through the early hours, but spreading inland through the morning with some heavier outbreaks. Further rain across all ranges at times through the afternoon, turning lighter after dusk.

Maximum wind: West or Southwest 15-20 mph, occasionally gusting 25-30 mph in the morning.

Chance of cloud free mountain/hill tops above 800m: Nil from around dawn.

Visibility: Generally poor at height with cloud persistent above around 500m for much of the day, occasionally down to lower levels on the Cuillins and down to Knoydart in the morning.

Temperature: **Glens:** Plus 2 Celsius rising to 5 Celsius.
At 800m: Zero Celsius rising to plus 2 Celsius.
Freezing level: 1100-1300m
