


National Severe Weather Warning Service



Chief Forecasters Assessment

An increasingly unstable airmass will spread north across the Irish Sea today, and with southeasterly winds developing across Northern Ireland, heavy and thundery showers will be blown inland across the eastern side of the province in particular. This afternoon a trough could well bring some more organised heavy showers, and there remains a risk of hail and thunder. The showers could bring 10mm of rain within a short period of time and 20-30mm within a few hours. This would be enough to cause some localised surface water flooding, especially where drainage is reduced by fallen leaves. While the showers are expected to become much more isolated tonight, a few may linger around coastal districts.

The Met Office have issued a **Yellow Warning of Rain**

Valid from **11:00 on Wed, 08th Oct 2014** until **21:00 on Wed, 08th Oct 2014**

Scattered heavy, and possibly thundery showers will spread in from the Irish Sea during the morning. These will become more persistent during the afternoon and early evening, before becoming more isolated and confined to coastal areas tonight. The public should be aware of the risk of localised surface water flooding from these showers.
