**Confidence:** Remaining settled on Sunday but some wet and windy weather for later on Monday, timing of the rainfall on Monday is a little uncertain and becoming quite windy over the mid week period as well as showery from Tuesday. Medium confidence for it turning colder from the middle of the week too.

**Headline for Sunday 08 May 2022:** Settled with some dry and bright conditions. Winds strengthening later.

### Forecast for Sunday 08 May 2022

**Weather:** Some early mist or even fog patches is possible but these will clear in the morning to leave a dry day with some bright or sunny spells. Perhaps more cloud building later in the day from the west and winds strengthening as a frontal system pushes into western Scotland. Remaining dry and cloudy through the evening.

**Chance of cloud-free hill tops above 800m:** 80% increasing to nearly 100%, some patchy low cloud at the start of the day.

**Low cloud and visibility:** Patchy cloud above 700m is possible at the start of the day, just shrouding hill tops initially. This will clear to leave cloud bases much higher for the rest of the day with good visibility which may turn a little hazy at times.

**Met Office Aberdeen Meteorologist's View**

Overall a good outlook for walking for all ranges, breezier on the tops later in the day and still feeling a little cool around dawn and dusk. Feeling warmest for the Moray and Speyside hills.

**Forecast for Monday 09 May 2022**

**Weather:** Mainly dry and cloudy overnight but light rain spreading across western ranges by breakfast time, the rain will spread east during the morning but some of the more eastern ranges, perhaps around the Ladder Hills will remain dry for most of the day, given their sheltered position. Rain will be more persistent west of the A9 and accompanied by strong winds it will be quite an unpleasant afternoon here. Rain is expected to turn more showery by the evening with eastern ranges becoming drier.

**Maximum wind:** Southerly 25-30 gust 35-40mph becoming southwesterly in the afternoon.

**Chance of cloud-free hill tops above 800m:** 30-60%, in the west 30% more low cloud building around western ranges, 60% in the east with the Moray and Speyside hill seeing a lot of shelter.

**Low cloud and visibility:** Broken low cloud above 500m for western ranges but becoming more scattered or patchy in the east and lifting to 700m and above. Visibility will be moderate or poor in rain in the west but will be good at times around Moray and Speyside.

**Temperature:** **Glens:** Plus 8 rising to 12 Celsius, perhaps 15 Celsius for parts of Moray.

**At 800m:** Plus 4 Celsius

**Freezing level:** Above all summits.
