Here is the weather forecast for the inshore waters of Great Britain and Northern Ireland valid for the following 24 hours.

General Situation: high slow moving over Denmark. Low to west of Iberia moving slowly northwest.

From Cape Wrath to Duncansby Head including Orkney.
Wind: mainly south or southeast 2 or 3, but south 4 or 5 near Duncansby Head and around Orkney.
fair.
Visibility: moderate or good.

Shetland.
Wind: south or southwest 4 or 5, decreasing 3 later.
fair.
Visibility: moderate or good.

From Duncansby Head to Whitby.
Wind: south or southeast 3 or 4, occasionally 5 near Rattray Head, veering southwest 2 in Moray Firth.
fair.
Visibility: moderate occasionally poor.

From Whitby to North Foreland.
Wind: east or southeast 4 or 5, occasionally 6 in south.
fair.
Visibility: moderate occasionally poor.

From North Foreland to St. Catherine's Point.
Wind: east 4 or 5, occasionally 6.
fair.
Visibility: moderate occasionally good.

From St. Catherine's Point to Lands End.
Wind: east 4 or 5, occasionally 6, increasing 7 at times later near Lands End.
fair.
Visibility: moderate or good.

From Lands End to Colwyn Bay.
Wind: east or southeast 4 or 5, occasionally 6, increasing 7 at times later near Lands End.
fair.
Visibility: moderate or good.

From Colwyn Bay to Mull of Kintyre including Lough Foyle to Carlingford Lough.
Wind: southeast 4 or 5.
fair.
Visibility: moderate or good.

From Mull of Kintyre to Cape Wrath.
Wind: southeast 3 or 4, occasionally 5.
fair.
Visibility: moderate or good.
