Here is the weather forecast for the inshore waters of Great Britain and Northern Ireland valid for the following 24 hours.

General Situation: high pressure will persist across the United Kingdom during Sunday, with a weak cold front gradually losing it's identity across Wales and central England. Meanwhile, a weak warm front will push eastwards across Scotland.

From Cape Wrath to Duncansby Head including Orkney.  
Wind: northwest backing southwest 3 or 4, increasing 5 to 7 later.  
occasional drizzle later.  
Visibility: good, occasionally moderate in drizzle.

Shetland.  
Wind: variable 3 or less becoming south 4 or 5, veering southwest 6 or 7 later.  
showers, with rain later.  
Visibility: good, becoming moderate or poor later.

From Duncansby Head to Whitby.  
Wind: westerly or northwesterly 3 backing southwesterly 4 or 5, occasionally 6 later in north.  
fair, risk of mist patches later in south.  
Visibility: mainly good, occasionally poor in mist.

From Whitby to North Foreland.  
Wind: northerly 3 or 4 becoming variable 3 or less.  
fair, risk of mist patches later.  
Visibility: mainly good, occasionally poor in mist.

From North Foreland to St. Catherine's Point.  
Wind: northerly or northeasterly 3 or less, occasionally 4 in east.  
fair, risk of mist patches at first and later.  
Visibility: moderate or good, occasionally poor in mist.

From St. Catherine's Point to Lands End.  
Wind: easterly or northeasterly 3 or less, occasionally 4 in west.  
fair, risk of mist patches at first and later.  
Visibility: moderate or good, occasionally poor in mist.

From Lands End to Colwyn Bay.  
Wind: easterly or northeasterly 3 or 4, becoming variable 3 or less in the south, but becoming southwesterly 3 or 4 in north.  
occasional drizzle.  
Visibility: moderate or good.

From Colwyn Bay to Mull of Kintyre including Lough Foyle to Carlingford Lough.  
Wind: variable 3 or less becoming southwest 4 or 5.  
occasional drizzle.  
Visibility: moderate or good.

From Mull of Kintyre to Cape Wrath.  
Wind: south 3 or less veering southwest 5 to 7.  
occasional rain or drizzle.  
Visibility: good becoming moderate or poor.
