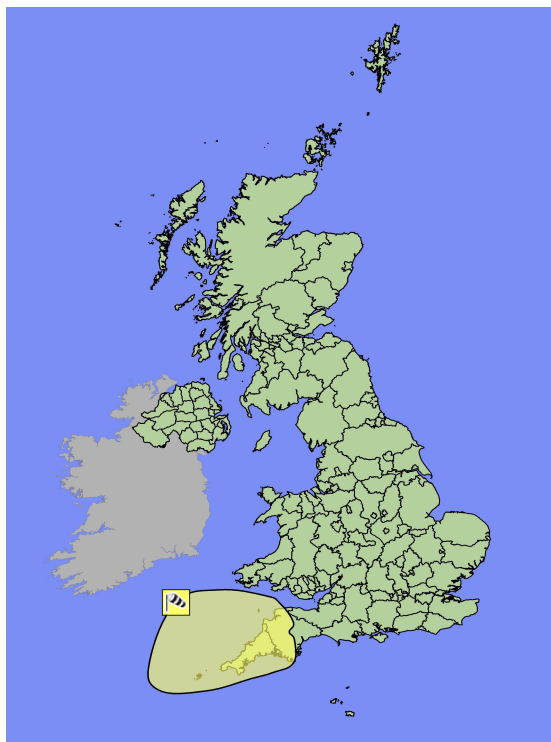




National Severe Weather Warning Service



Chief Forecasters Assessment

As a deep depression comes southwards into the North Sea on Tuesday, severe gale or storm force winds look likely to develop over southwest England for a time, with large waves on coasts exposed to the west or northwest.

The Met Office have issued a **Yellow Warning of Wind**

Valid from **09:00 on Tue, 05th Feb 2013** until **17:00 on Tue, 05th Feb 2013**

West to northwesterly winds will increase during Tuesday with gusts of 60 mph and as high as 70-75 mph across southern and western Cornwall and the Isles of Scilly.

The public are advised to be aware of the risk of disruption to transport.
