Forecast for Wednesday 06 Mar 2024

Weather: Patchy mist and fog at glen level gradually clearing through the morning. Otherwise a dry and bright day with good sunny spells at times. Skye and Torridon will see the best of the sunshine while Ben Wyvis will have more in the way of cloud. Fresh to strong southeasterly winds on the summits.

Chance of cloud-free hill tops above 800m: 70% in the southwest, but 40% over Ben Wyvis.

Low cloud and visibility: Very good visibility outside of low level mist and fog. Some patchy summit cloud, occasionally more extensive across inland ranges with bases 900m.

Met Office Aberdeen Meteorologist’s View

Note summit wind chill.

Forecast for Thursday 07 Mar 2024

Weather: Early mist and fog at glen level clearing through the morning. Otherwise a dry day with plenty of sunshine, especially in the morning before increased amounts of fair weather cloud in the afternoon.

Maximum wind: 30-40mph

Chance of cloud-free hill tops above 800m: 80%

Low cloud and visibility: Very good outside of low level mist and fog during the morning. Fair weather cloud increasing in the afternoon, mainly above summit level.

Temperature: **Glens:** Plus 1C rising to Plus 7C
 At 800m: Plus 1 C
 Freezing level: 900m
