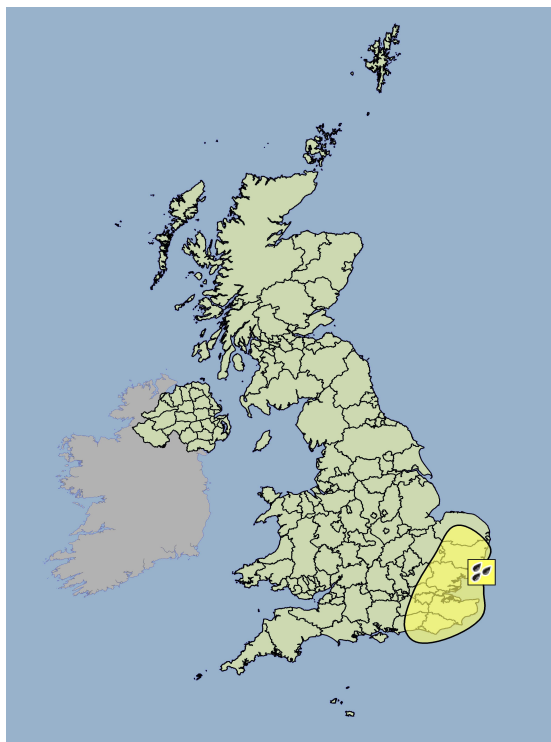




National Severe Weather Warning Service



Chief Forecasters Assessment

An active complex frontal zone is expected to move northwards into southeast England this evening bringing the threat of some heavy rain along with thunderstorms which could give frequent lightning and possibly gusty winds - more especially in the east of the area. As is usual in such situations there are uncertainties in the details. Whilst some spots, particularly in the east, could get 20 mm in less than an hour and over 30 mm in 2 or 3 hours, other places could well miss the worst.

The Met Office have issued a **Yellow Warning of Rain**

Valid from **18:00 on Wed, 21st May 2014** until **23:55 on Wed, 21st May 2014**

Outbreaks of heavy and locally thundery rain are expected to move northwards across southeast England and parts of East Anglia later today, perhaps accompanied by gusty winds.

The public should be aware of the risk of localised flooding.

This warning has been updated to extend the risk further north across eastern England and to cater for a low risk of medium impacts.
