Forecast for Monday 01 Aug 2022

Weather: Dry for much of the day with sunny spells. Higher cloud will begin to spill in from the west during the afternoon in advance of thickening cloud and occasionally heavy rain through the evening and overnight.

Chance of cloud-free hill tops above 800m: 90% until the end of the afternoon, then becoming 30% by the end of the evening.

Low cloud and visibility: Good visibility with any cloud mainly above the summits until late in the day. Low cloud with bases down to 400 or 500 m extending east through the evening. Visibility accompanying evening rain and low cloud will be moderate or poor, occasionally very poor within cloud.

Met Office Aberdeen Meteorologist's View

Note chilly temperatures on the tops, with feels like temperatures near freezing early and late in the day.

Forecast for Tuesday 02 Aug 2022

Weather: Cloudy and mainly overcast with outbreaks of rain or drizzle. Windy with strong to gale force southwesterly winds.

Maximum wind: Southwesterly, mean 40 mph gusting 50-55 mph.

Chance of cloud-free hill tops above 800m: 20% becoming 50% in the afternoon. Best chances across eastern hills.

Low cloud and visibility: Low cloud down to 500 or 600 m in the morning, gradually lifting to around 700 or 800 m in the afternoon and evening, though some lower bases persisting in the west. Moderate or good visibility outside of cloud, becoming very poor within low cloud.

Temperature: **Glens:** Plus 17 or 18 Celsius.
At 800m: Plus 12 or 13 Celsius.
Freezing level: Above summits.
