



National Severe Weather Warning Service



Chief Forecasters Assessment

An active frontal zone will become slow-moving and roughly aligned west to east across England and Wales on Friday. The most likely position is across central and northern Wales to East Anglia. Amounts of rainfall are expected to be 10 to 15 mm for most and 20 to 40 mm locally. To the south of this zone, southern parts of England and Wales, will see brighter conditions developing through the morning however this will allow heavy, slow moving, thundery showers to develop. These have the potential to generate as much as 20mm of rainfall in an hour locally. The general rainfall amounts would not normally present too many problems, but given the wet ground some localised flooding is possible. As suggested above there remains uncertainty in the position of the frontal zone and heaviest rain so please watch for possible updates to this alert.

The Met Office have issued a **Yellow Warning of Rain**

Valid from **02:00 on Fri, 13th Jul 2012** until **23:59 on Fri, 13th Jul 2012**

Many parts of central, eastern and southern England will have further spells of rain on Friday which will be heavy in places. The more persistent rain appears more likely across parts of central, northern and eastern England whilst somewhat drier conditions may well extend across southern counties for a time. However there is then the risk of some heavy slow moving showers developing.

The public should be aware that given saturated ground across many parts, localised flooding and disruption to travel may result..
