Forecast for Friday 07 Jan 2022

Weather: Scattered snow showers this morning, these most frequent and occasionally heavy west of the A9 during the first part of the morning. The afternoon will become mainly dry with some sunshine, just isolated showers in the west.

Chance of cloud free mountain/hill tops above 800m: 70%

Visibility: Poor in snow with whiteout conditions in heavy showers at first. Otherwise excellent visibility with great air clarity. Cloud briefly lowering to 750 metres as showers pass by.

Met Office Aberdeen Meteorologist's View

Feeling bitterly cold, snow may blowing around in the wind at height

Forecast for Saturday 08 Jan 2022

Weather: A band of snow will quickly spread east first thing on Saturday morning, although amounts of snow will be variable. Then drier and clearer weather extending east to leave a bright afternoon with occasional snow showers, these mainly across the west. Feeling very cold in the strong summit winds. Some icy surfaces developing as freezing level rises in the morning.

Maximum wind: Westerly 30 to 40 mph, although southerly 50 to 60 mph at first

Chance of cloud free mountain/hill tops above 800m: 60%

Visibility: Poor in cloud down to 500 metres at first, this most extensive in the west and south of the area. Cloud becoming well broken in the afternoon, lowering to 700 metres in showers

Temperature: **Glens:** Minus 2 rising to 3 Celsius
At 800m: Minus 3 rising to 1 Celsius for a time, falling back to minus 1 Celsius
Freezing level: 200 metres, rising to 800 to 1000 metres for a short time around the middle of the day, then falling back to 600 metres
