


National Severe Weather Warning Service



Chief Forecasters Assessment

A front will become slow-moving over southern and central Scotland and parts of northwest England on Thursday afternoon and night, before clearing southeastwards during Friday morning. There is currently some uncertainty over its position and timing but the yellow area depicts the most likely region for some minor disruption due to heavy rainfall.

The Met Office have issued a **Yellow Warning of Rain**

Valid from **15:00 on Thu, 06th Mar 2014** until **09:00 on Fri, 07th Mar 2014**

Outbreaks of rain will become heavier and more persistent during Thursday afternoon and evening, before clearing from the northwest during Friday morning. Accumulations of 20-30 mm are expected quite widely, with 40-50 mm over the hills and as much as 70 mm or more over parts of western Cumbria.

The public should be aware of the risk of some minor travel disruption due to flooding on roads.
