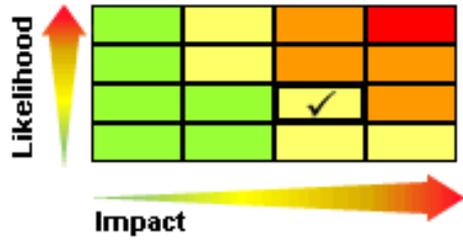



National Severe Weather Warning Service



Chief Forecasters Assessment

Warm, moist air from the continent will be made more unstable by a system coming over it from the Atlantic, bringing the risk of 20 mm rainfall or more in an hour and 50 mm in a few hours. Many areas will miss the showers and storms, but where they do occur expect localised flooding and hail, whilst lightning strikes could disrupt power supplies.

The Met Office have issued a **Yellow Warning of Rain**

Valid from **13:00 on Tue, 07th Jun 2016** until **06:00 on Wed, 08th Jun 2016**

Isolated heavy, thundery showers will turn locally torrential with the risk of hail on Tuesday afternoon and become more widespread through the evening, perhaps lasting through the night in some areas. Whilst most places will miss the worst, please be aware of the risk of localised flooding, with lightning presenting an additional hazard.

This warning has been updated to adjust the yellow area, increase the likelihood of some isolated medium impacts, and also to extend the validity period through to Wednesday morning.
