Forecast for Wednesday 07 Sep 2022

Weather: Some heavy rain in the north at first especially from the northern Cairngorms to Strathdon, chance of thunder, then brightening up to a day of bright spells and scattered showers, again locally heavy with the chance of thunder.

Chance of cloud-free hill tops above 800m: 30%, best chances in west of area.

Low cloud and visibility: Occasional fog above about 700-900m, mainly in south and east. Below cloud, visibility mainly good, but interruptions to poor visibility as heavier showers pass by.

Met Office Aberdeen Meteorologist's View

Some difficult walking conditions due to a strong wind on the tops.

Forecast for Thursday 08 Sep 2022

Weather: Mainly dry, bright start then showers developing during the morning. Some heavy showers are likely in the afternoon and evening, again more especially in east of area.

Maximum wind: East winds with average speeds of 20 to 25 mph and gusts 35mph on the tops.

Chance of cloud-free hill tops above 800m: 60%

Low cloud and visibility: Once again extensive mist with fog above about 600 to 700m. Occasionally good visibility and higher cloud bases between showers, especially in west of area.

Temperature: **Glens:** 14 Celsius rising to 18 Celsius.
At 800m: Plus 14 Celsius.
Freezing level: Staying well above the summits.
