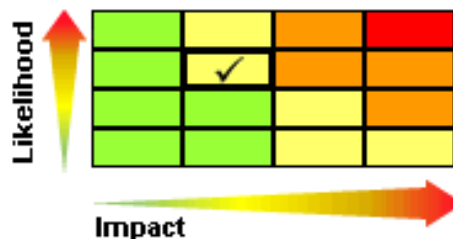
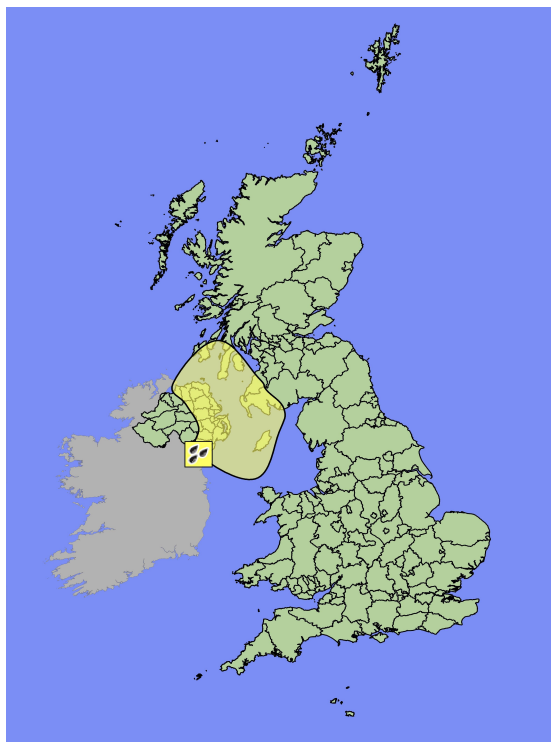




National Severe Weather Warning Service



Chief Forecasters Assessment

The slow-moving depression centred over Ireland will continue to feed showers up through the Irish Sea to threaten parts of Northern Ireland and southwest Scotland. A further 15 to 30 mm of rain is possible locally, where showers align, although in general amounts will be less.

The Met Office have issued a **Yellow Warning of Rain**

Valid from **14:10 on Thu, 18th Oct 2012** until **23:00 on Thu, 18th Oct 2012**

Heavy showers with localised thundery downpours will continue to affect eastern and some northern parts of Northern Ireland and parts of southwest Scotland today.

With the ground already saturated in places, especially across counties Antrim and Down, the public should be aware that localised flooding may result.
