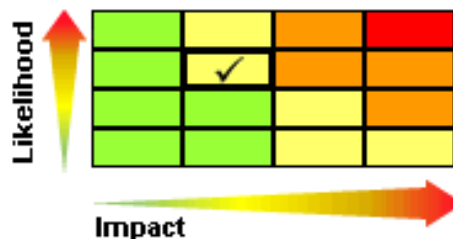
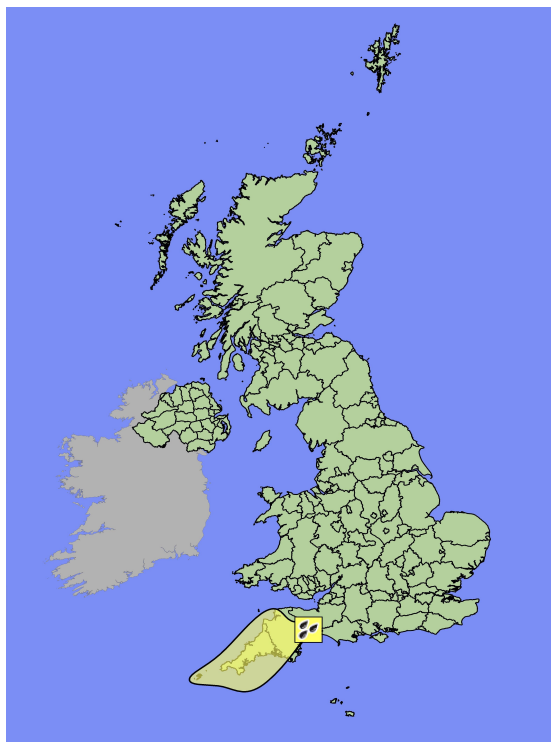




National Severe Weather Warning Service



Chief Forecasters Assessment

Complex developments towards the southwest approaches, involving mild, humid air, seem likely to generate spells of heavy rain through the second half of Wednesday. The area most at risk is difficult to pin down at this stage, and updates to this warning may yet be required.

The Met Office have issued a **Yellow Warning of Rain**

Valid from **12:00 on Wed, 09th May 2012** until **23:59 on Wed, 09th May 2012**

One or more periods of heavy rain are likely to cross southern parts of England on Wednesday afternoon and evening.

The public should be aware that this may lead to difficult driving conditions due to standing water and surface spray and the possibility of localised flooding.
