Forecast for Tuesday 02 Mar 2021

Weather: Clear spells and some mist and low cloud overnight. The low cloud and mist could be extensive during the morning, particularly around Ben Lawers, the Ochils and Angus Hills. Most of this should lift and clear during the morning, but the low cloud and mist could persist on some east and southeast facing slopes.

Chance of cloud free mountain/hill tops above 800m: 80%, with most cloud below 800m, summits mainly clear of cloud.

Visibility: Moderate or poor in low cloud and mist, otherwise good or very good.

Met Office Aberdeen Meteorologist's View

A low level temperature inversion should see most of the higher summits cloud free and mostly sunny.

Forecast for Wednesday 03 Mar 2021

Weather: Low cloud and mist becoming extensive again overnight. Much of this should lift and clear during the morning, but probably rather cloudy overall. However, a significant temperature inversion could keep the higher summits cloud free and mostly sunny.

Maximum wind: North 10 to 15mph

Chance of cloud free mountain/hill tops above 800m: 70%, most cloud below 900m with higher summits mainly clear due to temperature inversion.

Visibility: Moderate or poor in low cloud and mist, otherwise good or very good.

Temperature: **Glens:** Zero Celsius rising to plus 7 Celsius
At 800m: Zero Celsius rising to plus 4 Celsius
Freezing level: Around 800m overnight, rising above the summits during the day.
