Forecast for Thursday 03 Jun 2021

Weather: Staying dry overnight with clear periods. Patches of mist and low cloud forming over Caithness hills, soon dispersing on Thursday morning. Then much of the day will be dry and bright with sunny spells. Thicker cloud edging up from the south during the afternoon may produce an isolated light shower.

Chance of cloud free mountain/hill tops above 800m: 90%

Visibility: Very good although a slight haziness will result in more distant hills lacking clarity. Patches of cloud forming about 800m but most of the clouds will be above the tops.

Met Office Aberdeen Meteorologist's View

Sunburn and dehydration will be the main hazards.

Forecast for Friday 04 Jun 2021

Weather: It will be a mostly dry, bright day with sunny spells and any mist and low cloud at first, quickly dispersing.

Maximum wind: Southerly winds with average speeds of 15 to 20mph on the tops.

Chance of cloud free mountain/hill tops above 800m: 90%

Visibility: Very good with occasional cloud cover building mostly above the tops. Some patches forming around 700 to 800m.

Temperature: **Glens:** 10 Celsius rising to 19 Celsius.
At 800m: 8 Celsius rising to 13 Celsius.
Freezing level: Well above the summits.
