Forecast for Sunday 06 Feb 2022

Weather: Spells of heavy rain to start the morning with sleet or snow above 800m for a time. This will soon clear then bright spells and a few showers coming and going for the rest of the day, these falling as snow above 800m. Showers dying out through the evening with lengthening clear spells.

Chance of cloud-free hill tops above 600m: Almost nil chance at first but improving in the morning to around 80%. Views will briefly disappear in any showers.

Low cloud and visibility: Poor in the early hours and to start the morning with extensive cloud above 500m. Generally improving in the morning; excellent between showers but briefly poor with patchy cloud and fog above 500m as showers move through. Becoming good in evening.

Meteorologist's View

A windy and cold day on the tops with gusts of 60mph making for difficult and potentially dangerous conditions on summits and exposed ridges above 600m.

Forecast for Monday 07 Feb 2022

Weather: Clear spells and a frost overnight. A dry and bright start but cloud increasing through the morning. Outbreaks of light rain or drizzle, briefly preceded by snow above 700m, will spread east during the afternoon. Rain mostly fizzling out through late afternoon with perhaps some fleeting bright or clear intervals to end the day.

Maximum wind: West or Southwest 15mph gusts 25mph, increasing 25-30mph gusts 40mph through the afternoon.

Chance of cloud-free hill tops 600m: 90% overnight and most of the morning but becoming almost nil through early afternoon as cloud descends.

Low cloud and visibility: Excellent for most of the morning but cloud and fog becoming extensive above 300 or 400m early afternoon. Cloud will lift later but summits remaining in fog. Outside of cloud, good becoming hazy or poor as rain arrives.

Temperature: **Valleys:** Minus 1 Celsius gradually rising to 10 or 11 Celsius.
At 600m: Minus 2 Celsius, rising to Plus 6 Celsius.
Freezing level: 500m at first, rising above summits by afternoon.
