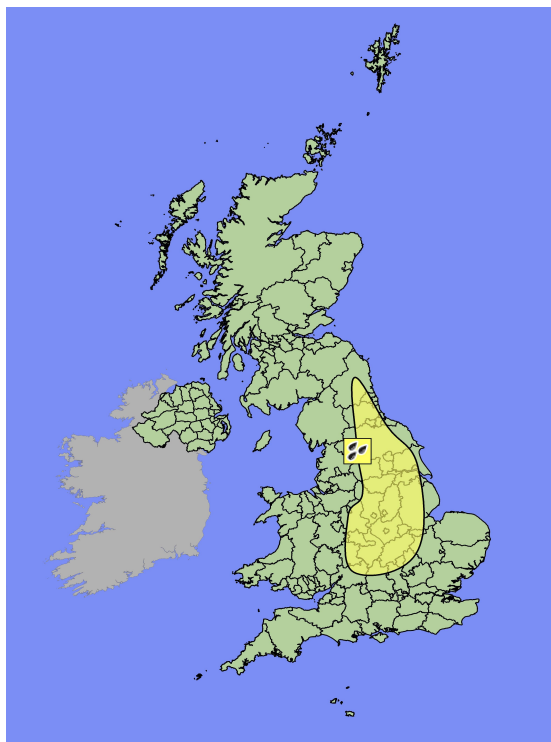




National Severe Weather Warning Service



Chief Forecasters Assessment

High temperatures across southern and south-eastern parts of England will trigger well isolated thunderstorms later today, but the main areas at risk from heavy and slow moving downpours with hail will be across parts of the Midlands and north-east England during the late afternoon and evening.

The Met Office have issued a **Yellow Warning of Rain**

Valid from **15:00 on Sat, 23rd Apr 2011** until **23:00 on Sat, 23rd Apr 2011**

Heavy showers and thunderstorms will develop later this afternoon and early evening. Rainfall totals of 20-30 mm are possible in less than 2 hours in a few places.
