Here is the weather forecast for the inshore waters of Great Britain and Northern Ireland valid for the following 24 hours.

General Situation: large high persisting southern Scandinavia while complex low moves north across Iceland.

From Cape Wrath to Duncansby Head including Orkney.

Wind: south or southeast 3 or 4, occasionally 5.

fair.

Visibility: moderate or good.

Shetland.

Wind: southerly 5 or 6.

fair.

Visibility: mainly moderate.

From Duncansby Head to Whitby.

Wind: south or southeast 4 or 5, occasionally 6 around Rattray Head.

fair.

Visibility: moderate or poor.

From Whitby to North Foreland.

Wind: east or southeast 3 or 4, increasing 5 later.

fair.

Visibility: moderate, occasionally poor in north.

From North Foreland to St. Catherine's Point.

Wind: east or northeast 4 or 5, occasionally 6 later.

fair.

Visibility: moderate or good.

From St. Catherine's Point to Lands End.

Wind: east or southeast 4 or 5, occasionally 6 later.

light rain later.

Visibility: moderate or good.

From Lands End to Colwyn Bay.

Wind: east or southeast 4 or 5, occasionally 6 later.

fair.

Visibility: moderate or good.

From Colwyn Bay to Mull of Kintyre including Lough Foyle to Carlingford Lough.

Wind: southeasterly 4 or 5, occasionally 6 in north.

fair.

Visibility: moderate or good.

From Mull of Kintyre to Cape Wrath.

Wind: south or southeast 5 or 6, occasionally 7 for a time.

fair.

Visibility: moderate or good.
