Forecast for Sunday 04 Jul 2021

Weather: Mainly dry through the early hours with some mist and low cloud by dawn. This soon clearing on Sunday morning, with some spells of sunshine developing, but also with showers developing, these locally heavy and thundery by afternoon. Showers persisting well into the evening.

Chance of cloud free mountain/hill tops above 600m: 30% improving to 80% by mid-morning but reducing again in heavy showers.

Visibility: Poor in places at first but improving to good during the morning. Moderate in heavy showers.

Forecast for Monday 05 Jul 2021

Weather: Scattered showers not as frequent or as heavy as Sunday. Some bright spells but cloud increasing later with heavy rain arriving during the evening.

Maximum wind: Southwesterly 15-20 gust 25-30 mph

Chance of cloud free mountain/hill tops above 600m: 20% improving to 90%. 10% in late evening heavy rain.

Visibility: Poor at first but improving to very good during the morning with some lowering in showers. Poor in heavy rain later.

Temperature: **Valleys:** Ps 8 Celsius increasing to Ps 21 Celsius
At 600m: Ps 8 increasing to Ps 11 Celsius
Freezing level: well above summits
