



National Severe Weather Warning Service



Chief Forecasters Assessment
 Areas of heavy showers are expected to persist during Tuesday night, and although falling as rain, sleet or hail in many places, the slow moving nature of the showers means that there is a risk of very localised heavy snow, chiefly on ground above 200 metres.

The Met Office have issued a **Yellow Warning of Snow**

Valid from **22:30 on Tue, 19th Mar 2013** until **09:00 on Wed, 20th Mar 2013**

Slow moving heavy showers will fall as snow in places across Wales, leading to very localised accumulations of 5-10 cm of snow, chiefly on ground above 200 metres.

The public should be aware of the localised disruption to travel
