Forecast for Thursday 09 Sep 2021

Weather: Cloud increasing from the north overnight to bring some drizzly showers, however staying dry and clear towards the southern end of the Great Glen. Best of the dry, bright weather across southern ranges, particularly during the morning, while the north stays rather cloudy. Scattered showers appearing, these tending to turn also heavier into the afternoon increasing the risk of thunder and hail.

Chance of cloud free mountain/hill tops above 800m: Ranging from 20% in the north and 75% in the south.

Visibility: Good becoming moderate or poor in showers, very poor in hill fog, with bases ranging from broken to extensive from 450m in the north and scattered from 600m in the south.

Met Office Aberdeen Meteorologist's View

Potentially hazardous conditions across the north in hill fog, also in thunderstorms, most likely later in the day.

Forecast for Friday 10 Sep 2021

Weather: Similar to Thursday with scattered showers, with some risk of hail and thunder, also the best of the brightness in the south, while the north remains rather cloudy.

Maximum wind: Variable 15mph or less.

Chance of cloud free mountain/hill tops above 800m: Ranging from 30% in the north and 70% in the south.

Visibility: Good becoming moderate or poor in showers, very poor in hill fog, with bases ranging from broken to extensive from 450m in the north and scattered from 600m in the south.

Temperature: **Glens:** Plus 8 Celsius increasing 22 Celsius during the afternoon
At 800m: Plus 9-11 Celsius
Freezing level: Well above summits
