Forecast for Wednesday 10 Feb 2021

Weather: Very cold, particularly at height with perhaps a few scattered snow showers appearing overnight and early to mid-morning, mainly confined to ranges north of the A835. However most will stay dry with plenty of weak winter sunshine around.

Chance of cloud free mountain/hill tops above 800m: 70% at first in north and east, otherwise 90% plus.

Visibility: Generally very good but poor or very poor in snow showers, also in drifting and where snow bases lower 500-700m in and around showers.

Met Office Aberdeen Meteorologist's View

Severe wind chill and drifting difficulties anticipated despite the not particularly brisk winds.

Forecast for Thursday 11 Feb 2021

Weather: Very cold again, but most ranges dry with further prolonged sunshine. However a scattering of snow showers edging into the north and east during the evening.

Maximum wind: Easterly increasing from mid-day, 20-25mph by early evening with gusts reaching 40mph across most exposed ridges and summits.

Chance of cloud free mountain/hill tops above 800m: 95% plus, becoming 60% later in north and east.

Visibility: Generally excellent or very good but poor or very poor in later snow showers, also in drifting and where snow bases lower over hills in and around showers.

Temperature: **Glens:** Minus 13 Celsius peaking at plus 1 Celsius during afternoon
At 800m: Minus 8-10 Celsius
Freezing level: All levels
