Forecast for Thursday 04 Nov 2021

Weather: Clear spells overnight, cold with a patchy frost in sheltered glens. Then a dry day with plenty of sunshine in the south, but patchy cloud across the Aberdeenshire hills, this lifting and dispersing through the day. Increasingly cloudy through the evening, perhaps a few spots of light rain across northern hills late evening.

Chance of cloud free mountain/hill tops above 800m: 90%

Visibility: Very good. Any patchy early morning cloud around munro level across the Cairngorms soon lifting above the summits.

Met Office Aberdeen Meteorologist's View

Note the bitterly cold feels like temperatures despite a largely sunny day for many.

Forecast for Friday 05 Nov 2021

Weather: Dry with occasional clear periods overnight. Dry throughout the day. Cloudy across western hills around Braemar and Pitlochry. Some bright or sunny spells further east across the Aberdeenshire and Angus hills. Cloud increasing across all ranges late evening.

Maximum wind: West 20 gusting 30 mph.

Chance of cloud free mountain/hill tops above 800m: 20-30% across western Aberdeenshire and Perthshire. 60% across eastern Aberdeenshire and Angus.

Visibility: Very good outside of any low cloud. Often poor on the tops, particularly in the west where cloud likely to be persistent above 700-800m, perhaps a few breaks in the afternoon. Cloud patchier in the east, mainly above 800-900m.

Temperature: **Glens:** Plus 2 Celsius rising to 9 Celsius
At 800m: Plus 3 or 4 Celsius
Freezing level: Above the summits.
