Forecast for Monday 03 Oct 2022

Weather: Dry in the morning, some areas of low cloud around Rannoch Moor and Ben Alder. Outbreaks of rain will spread northeast for a time in the afternoon. Further outbreaks of rain expected after dark, these turning persistent across the southwest of the area but some drier interludes expected east of the A9.

Chance of cloud-free hill tops above 800m: 60%, best chance in the north of the region

Low cloud and visibility: Areas of low cloud down to 800 metres at first across the southwest. Low cloud becoming more widespread down to 700 metres across the southwest of the area as the afternoon progresses and especially after dark. However ranges elsewhere will be afforded some shelter and only see small amounts of cloud on the tops until after dark.

Met Office Aberdeen Meteorologist's View

Gusty southerly winds reaching 70 mph or more at times across the Cairngorm Plateau by afternoon.

Forecast for Tuesday 04 Oct 2022

Weather: Chance of some persistent rain in the morning, especially across the west of the area. Drier and brighter conditions are expected to spread from the west in the afternoon with a mostly dry end to the day. Windy.

Maximum wind: Southwesterly 45 to 55 mph on the higher tops, slowly moderating in the afternoon.

Chance of cloud-free hill tops above 800m: 60%

Low cloud and visibility: Low cloud down to 600 metres shrouding the summits across the south and west of the area at first, this clearing away through the morning with most summits clear of cloud by afternoon.

Temperature: **Glens:** Plus 8 rising to 14 Celsius
At 800m: Plus 8 Celsius
Freezing level: Above summits
