Forecast for Monday 08 Nov 2021

Weather: Long clear spells at first but cloud increasing from the west through the early hours. Cloud continues to increase through the morning with occasional rain affecting western hills, the rain spreading east through the afternoon with the odd heavier burst possible. The rain becomes light and patchier in the evening before more persistent rain edges east towards midnight.

Chance of cloud free mountain/hill tops above 800m: Close to 100% at first falling close to zero through the late morning and into the afternoon.

Visibility: Periods of persistent cloud above about 600-750m in the south from late morning. Otherwise visibility very good falling to several kilometres in rain.

Met Office Aberdeen Meteorologist's View

Valley temperatures may dip below freezing in east overnight and reach plus 14 or 15 Celsius by day. Significant chill expected over higher summits. Winds may gust close to 60mph over ridges and summits in the afternoon and evening.

Forecast for Tuesday 09 Nov 2021

Weather: Cloud and outbreaks of rain clearing overnight to leave a bright morning with sunny spells developing. A few showers are expected through the afternoon, these may become wintry on the Munro's.

Maximum wind: Southwesterly 30mph turning a little more westerly and becoming closer to 20-25mph by dawn. Still a risk of noticeable chill effect over higher mountains.

Chance of cloud free mountain/hill tops above 800m: Little chance overnight becoming close to 100% by, or shortly after, dawn. Chances fall to around 75% from late morning.

Visibility: Periods or persistent cloud above about 450m through the early hours clearing by dawn with occasional cloud above about 600m developing from late morning. Otherwise visibility several kilometres in overnight rain becoming very good but falling briefly close to a kilometre in any summit snow showers.

Temperature: **Glens:** Around plus 7 or 8 Celsius at dawn rising to plus 11 or 12 Celsius by midday.
At 800m: Plus 7 Celsius at midnight falling to plus 3 or 4 Celsius by, or shortly after, dawn.
Freezing level: Above the summits falling to around 1200m by, or shortly, after dawn.
