Forecast for Thursday 02 Jun 2022

Weather: Early mist patches in glens and lower slopes soon dispersing. Otherwise most ranges will be bright with sunny spells. There is just a chance of seeing an afternoon shower.

Chance of cloud-free hill tops above 800m: 90%

Low cloud and visibility: A few patches of poor visibility on lower slopes at first, otherwise very good visibility. Mostly clear skies at first but some cloud bubbling up during morning, bases around 800 to 900m in afternoon.

Met Office Aberdeen Meteorologist's View

Some fine hillwalking conditions over the next few days. However sunburn and dehydration will become an increasing hazard as temperatures rise.

Forecast for Friday 03 Jun 2022

Weather: It will be a dry day with plenty of sunshine. Mist and fog patches in some glens and lower slopes at first, more extensive over northern Cairngorms, soon dispersing.

Maximum wind: Light winds at all levels, mainly easterly with average speeds of only 10mph on the tops.

Chance of cloud-free hill tops above 800m: 90%

Low cloud and visibility: Patches of poor visibility on some lower slopes at first, otherwise very good visibility once again. There will also be patchy cloud cover developing by afternoon, again bases about 800 to 900m.

Temperature: **Glens:** Plus 5 Celsius rising to 18 Celsius by early afternoon.

At 800m: Plus 11 Celsius.

Freezing level: Above the summits.
