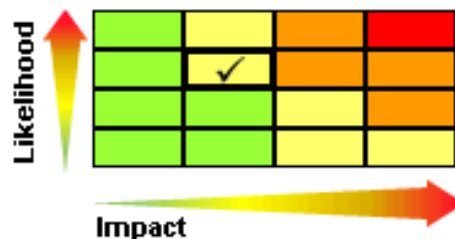
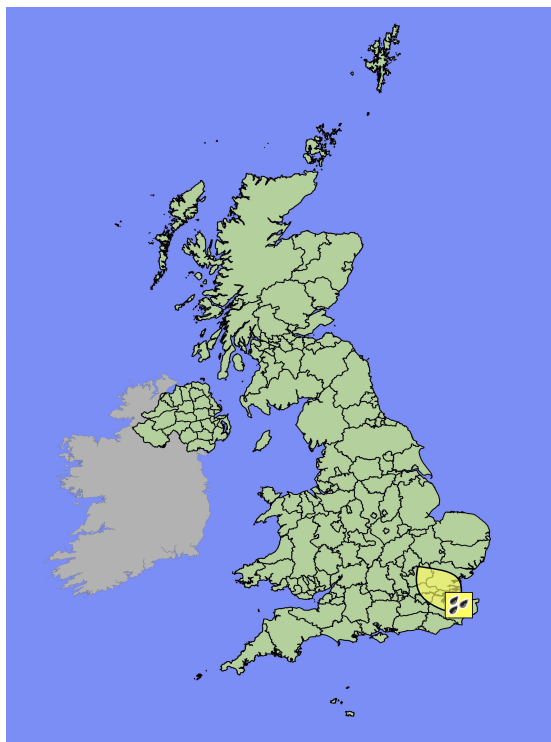




National Severe Weather Warning Service



Chief Forecasters Assessment

The build up of heat during the ongoing fine spell and the approach of a weak cold front are ingredients for intense thunderstorms. However, as is often the case, things are finely balanced and it is not clear whether heavy showers will materialise or not.

The Met Office have issued a **Yellow Alert of Rain**

Valid from **15:00 on Mon, 28th May 2012** until **23:00 on Mon, 28th May 2012**

Isolated thunderstorms later in the afternoon and during the evening have the potential to generate torrential downpours. The public should be aware of the risk of local flash flooding, especially in urban areas.
