Confidence: The main uncertainties lie in the extent of rainfall on Saturday and how far it pushes west. Confidence is high for unsettled weather and strong winds over the weekends and some wintriness on the north Grampians.

Headline for Saturday 02 Oct 2021: Strong southerly winds, rain spreading north, some ranges in the west staying dry.

Forecast for Saturday 02 Oct 2021

Weather: A few blustery showers in the overnight period but mainly confined to western ranges around Loch Tay and Glen Lyon. A dry and bright start to the day for most areas but cloud soon spilling north over the Angus Glens into Loch Muick and Glenshee as rainfall spreads north over the area for the afternoon. Precipitation is likely to be wintry for Lochnagar and Beinn a Ghlo other higher munros and will turn heavy at times. Potentially rain may clear the western ranges of Loch Tay in the afternoon with some late brightness here but likely to be a wet afternoon for the Southern Cairngorms and Aberdeenshire hills. Rain continuing in the evening in the east.

Chance of cloud free mountain/hill tops above 800m: 80% in the early morning, lowering to 20% in the afternoon as a lot of lower cloud spreads across the hills in association with the rain. More low cloud found over the eastern ranges.

Visibility: Very good visibility at the start of the day but cloud will spread north and begin to lower over summits. Cloud bases during the afternoon will be broken or extensive from 300m and rain or sleet will also cause the visibility to be poor or even very poor at times during the afternoon. Visibility and cloud bases will be slightly higher for the more westerly ranges of the region.

Met Office Aberdeen Meteorologist's View

Noticeable wind chill in gales on the summits and cold air. Freezing level will rise slightly during the day but precipitation will often be sleet or snow on the higher munro summits.

Forecast for Sunday 03 Oct 2021

Weather: Rain and cloud clearing overnight and a bright and mainly dry start to the day on Sunday but still very strong winds. During the afternoon further outbreaks of rain or showers are likely especially for the western ranges. It is likely to be dry again by the evening.

Maximum wind: Southwesterly 20-25 mph with gusts 35mph.

Chance of cloud free mountain/hill tops above 800m: 90%, some patches of low cloud in the morning around 700m. In the afternoon in the west chances will lower to 60% with scattered or broken cloud above 600m.

Visibility: Good or very good in the morning on Sunday but falling moderate or poor in the afternoon in rain in the west.

Temperature: **Glens:** Plus 5 rising to 9 Celsius.
At 800m: Plus 2 Celsius rising to 5 Celsius later.
Freezing level: 1200m rising to 1400m
