Confidence: High confidence for the arrival of Storm Barra on Tuesday with severe gales and a period of heavy snowfall. Lower confidence in the track of Storm Barra on Wednesday and the details of the forecast. High confidence for a return to slightly milder conditions by the end of the week,

Headline for Tuesday 07 Dec 2021: A stormy day with severe gales on the fells and a period of heavy snowfall above 300m, blizzards conditions possible.

Forecast for Tuesday 07 Dec 2021

Weather: A brief period of drier clearer conditions overnight for most of the area but feeling very cold with a significant wind chill likely in the fresh westerly winds. A reasonably bright start to the day but winds strengthening soon after dawn and cloud beginning to thicken from the west. A band of sleet and snow will spread across the area accompanied by severe gales and storm force gusts on higher peaks, snow is likely above 200m with a mix of rain and sleet at valley level. This will result in blizzard or whiteout conditions at times by late morning, a severe wind chill is expected in the wintry conditions. Although the main snow band will clear through by mid afternoon, wintry showers are soon expected, again accompanied by some storm force gusts.

Chance of cloud free mountain/hill tops above 800m: 90% falling to 10% associated with the band of snow crossing the area. There will be further breaks in the cloud later in the day but these may be hard to find if showers group together.

Visibility: Initially visibility will be good however it will rapidly deteriorate as low cloud develops over the tops and sleet and snow spread across the areas, cloud bases expected to be overcast above 300-400m. Very poor or whiteout conditions are likely at times as snow moves through. Brief periods of better visibility are likely by mid to late afternoon but any snow showers will soon cause it to deteriorate again.

Meteorologist's View

Extremely hazardous conditions on Tuesday with storm force gusts likely, particularly around mid afternoon, 80mph may be possible higher on Helvellyn or Scafell Pike. Note the extreme wind chill. Winds are also likely to cause blizzards or white out conditions at times.

Forecast for Wednesday 08 Dec 2021

Weather: A stormy start to Wednesday with frequent snow showers above 600m and southeasterly gales continue overnight. This will continue for much of the day with some showers turning heavy and a risk of thunder too, showers will turn to rain below 800m by the end of the day. Winds will gradually ease during the afternoon.

Maximum wind: Southeasterly 30 gusts 40mph gradually easing and becoming northwesterly 15-20mph later.

Chance of cloud free mountain/hill tops above 800m: 20% associated with frequent showers during the day, a few brighter spells but these will be hard to find.

Visibility: Cloud is likely to be broken or overcast above 500m with some patchy cloud below this, particularly in the west.

Temperature: **Valleys:** Plus 4 Celsius.
At 800m: Minus 1 rising to Plus 1 Celsius by evening.
Freezing level: 600m rising to 900m
