Observations on the weather, at Madbury.

Dec. 7 & 8.

Dec. 4. Fair & sunny (I am told a little frost) but a thick mist over the Town & Valley, was rising all day, appeared as a black cloud; it gradually increased, & hung over the River in S. Valley like a thick white cloud; & it seemed uncertain when it was from W. bound or proceeded from S. Dec. 5. Some parts of a field appeared quite clear, white & were covered. - [In the Town it was so thick that one could scarce see into the street; & had a very disagreeable smell.] By Degrees the sky grew quite overcast with watery clouds, but the Snow hills were clear, & there was little or no rain till Dec. 12 & 13, when it set in for a very wet Afternoon.

A. M. Taking a Journey Eastward, in N. River. observed some like clouds in N. Vallies; but very seldom comparable to that at Madbury, except one at a distance, it is supposed was over J. River Dart.

A. M. The latter Part of Nov. & the former Part of Dec. were very mild, till Dec. 22^d, when there came a cold stormy wind from the N. which continued on the 23^d, with cold water Snow; & by the morning of the 24th, the Snow was deep on the Ground, & much Snow fell in the Course of the Day.

This Day I was at full, at 3 Aft.
